On December 18, 1912 the Skull and Bones Honor Society was founded at the Pennsylvania State University. During our ninety years of existence we have initiated over 2,200 members and over 1,700 are still living. Many of these members have achieved excellence in their professional careers espousing the virtues of humble dignity and leadership that were first identified by their peers at Penn State. Many have also carried these lessons of humble service into their family life based on the number of "legacy" members the organization has been able to acknowledge.

For the first time ever, we are holding a formal banquet to commemorate the heritage of those twelve visionary students who founded our Society ninety years ago.

This celebratory reception and dinner will take place on Saturday, October 18, 2003 at the University Park campus. An hors d'oeuvres and cash-bar reception will begin at 7:00 that evening at The Penn Stater Conference Center Hotel. A sumptuous buffet dinner

with wine service will follow at 8:00 pm. This will be a great opportunity to reminisce and re-connect and it promises to be an exciting event. However, space is limited to the capacity of the ballroom, so we urge you to reserve your spot early! After six months of voting, the form of a long-term project for the group was decided when 42% of all respondents selected pursuing a Skull and Bones Room on campus. During a recent Board of Directors meeting the decision was finalized and preliminary work has begun to make this a reality. The Board echoed the sentiments of the voters in pointing out the

benefits of a permanent home for Skull and Bones. These include: a permanent address, the ability to maintain archival and historical materials and documents, a consistent location for small active gatherings, and frequency of need. We are excited about the potential of this project and hope to be able to make a major announcement about it in the coming months!

Welcome to the Spring 2003 edition of our Alumni Interest Group (AIG) newsletter! We are working on several exciting and beneficial projects described in the following pages. We always appreciate feedback on our plans, so please call or write with your thoughts – our contact information is inside!

One project we recently completed was updating our membership list and contact information. At this time last year we had the addresses of only 480 of our members. Since then we have identified the status of over 2,000 of the 2,200-plus individuals who have been initiated into Skull and Bones since our first class in 1912. This has allowed us to create a membership directory -- please see the box on the bottom of this page for details. Two individuals deserve a huge "thank you" for their work – done more than a decade ago – that enabled this project to be completed. Gerard Louison spent untold hours researching and compiling the names of all our members from 1912 through the 1970's. Then these names were merged with information Mary Anne Eves had begun compiling in the early 1980's. Without the unselfish leadership they displayed in these tasks many years ago, it would have been impossible to gather the contact information in the time that we did.


The result of this update is that this may be the first communication you have received from Skull and
