Phi Psi Goes Dry - The Phi Psi 500 may not raise as much money as it once did due to the State College Boro Council and Phi Psi fraternity's three year plan to remove alcohol from the event. The increasing amount of vandalism and public drunkenness caused many complaints from downtown residents and business owners. This is the first year that the Phi Psi will be completely dry and organizers hope to raise \$10,000 for charity. Two years ago the last race to include the original six bars raised \$22,000. Last year with three of the six bars eliminated it made only \$7,500. This year's Phi Psi 500 will no longer include bars but will be turned into a "Mardi Gras sort of parade" with increased emphasis on the Anything Goes category. Participants may dress up in costume and perform skits to win prizes. A food court will be set up in the parking lot outside of the Brewery for people to have a meal and watch the skits.

Brickhouse Moves to Brewery - St. Patrick's Day 1990 was the last hurrah for the Brickhouse. The building, believed to be the second oldest in State College, is due to be leveled to make way for a parking lot. But fear not. the home of the latest last call in town will move to larger quarters and reopen in mid-April. Brickhouse owner Carl Easterling bought the building housing the Brewery as well as Pizza Pi, The Penn State Sub Shop, and The Music Mart. Easterling is happy to have a larger area to present musical acts he brings in from New York and other east coast cities. People anxious to have a piece of the Brickhouse to remember it by were encouraged to act literally. Bricks were knocked out of the wall and carried home by the last customers, some were autographed by Easterling. Sunday morning police cordoned off the area in case what was left fell over.

Guillot later filed a lawsuit against Leasure. Leasure's new appointment is the result of discussions began January 12 with President Potts. The appointment was part of the settlement of the lawsuit. "We are happy to welcome Dr. Leasure back into the UNA family and look forward to utilizing his considerable skills in organizing and implementing a first-rate development and fund-raising program for the University of North Alabama", Potts said.
