THE BUSH/BONES CONNECTION - This could be a big year for all brothers & sisters of the Bone. Attention has focused on our distant cousins at Yale and their favorite son & brother George Bush. NO MORE FREE PARKING - Penn State plans to install about 175 parking meters in visitor parking lots on campus by August. The meters will charge 25 cents per hour and will replace the \$1.00 and \$2.00 fees now charged for visitor parking. In addition, about 20 short-term meters (10 cents for 15 minutes) will be installed near six buildings on campus -the Creamery; Eisenhower Auditorium; Shields Bldg.; The IM Bldg.; the driveway in front of the HUB; and Human Dev. East Bldg. Previously parking was allowed for 15 minutes in these spaces with car flashers. Students will not be allowed to park at any of these meters, all students MUST register their cars in order to drive on campus. So when you come to PSU bring lots of change and peel those student stickers off your car.

TWO NEW SORORITIES TO LOCATE IN EAST HALLS - The Panhellenic Council extended an offer of activation to two new sororities last spring, Delta Zeta and Sigma Sigma Sigma. The sororities will begin formal rush this fall and receive suites in East Halls in the fall of 1989.

FRATERNITY TRIAL FOLLOW-UP - Eleven fraternities convicted in May 1987 of serving alcohol to minors were sentenced in April 1988 with fines and community service. Acacia, Alpha Chi Rho, Alpha Epsilon Pi, Beta Sigma Beta, Phi Kappa Tau, Phi Kappa Theta, Phi Mu Delta, Pi Kappa Alpha, Sigma Pi, and Theta Delta Chi were each sentenced to pay \$200 in fines, perform 50 hours of community service, and placed on one year probation. Tau Kappa Epsilon was given a stiffer sentence because of a prior conviction on the same charges. TKE was fined \$500 and required to perform 200 hours of community service. All 11 fraternities intend to appeal the convictions to the Pennsylvania Superior Court. Attorney Edward Blanarik said he will argue the appeal on the grounds that the police should have had a search warrant to enter the fraternity house, and that they did not have probable cause to believe a crime was being committed. Additionally, the police should have had the beverages served analyzed and presented expert evidence that they were actually beer. Two undercover female State College officers entered fraternity houses, observed people drinking what they assumed to be alcohol, and alerted uniformed officers waiting outside to "card" these individuals when they left the fraternity.

RESTAURANT REVIEW - Boston's Penn State Deli

For all you Penn Staters in the Boston area, and those of you just visiting, there's a new restaurant that should be on your "must visit" list. Walking into the PENN STATE DELI at 25 New

Chardon St. in Boston's Government Center (around the corner from the Bowdoin T stop for you locals) is like stepping into State College.

Every time I go there I spend the first 15 minutes just looking at the decorations, what a fantastic job of interior design. A stand up Joe greets you at the door, PSU tiffany lamps hang from the ceiling, the tables are covered in Blue & White. The walls, covered by PSU wall paper, are filled with memorabilia from Dear Old State. JoePa and Nittany Lion football are featured prominently but there are also photos of town & campus, letters from Fran Fisher & Bryce Jordan, and many PSU posters the like of which can be found in any respectable dorm/fraternity/apartment. Like the Witch Doctor says on Sunday afternoons, "it's everything Penn State for every Penn Stater".

They also have amazing food! Like any good deli there are great reubens and club sandwiches. They have calzones for both vegetarians and carnivores. But for me, the best is the cheesesteak. Try a Pepper Steak Sub, loaded with broiled strips of steak (no wafer steaks here) and topped with crisp peppers and onions. It was one of the best I ever had, except in Philly and at C.C. Pepper's at 2:00 a.m.
